
Product Placement Guidelines

Interconnected Protection:

When one alarm is triggered, all connected alarms and devices are immediately activated throughout the home.





Ionization Smoke Alarm:

Provides early detection against smoke and fire; especially effective against flaming fires.



Photoelectric Smoke Alarm:

Provides early detection against smoke and fire; especially effective against flaming fires.



Carbon Monoxide Alarm:

Detects presence of deadly carbon monoxide.



Heat Alarm:

Alarms when temperatures reach 135°F or greater in areas where smoke alarms can false alarm due to auto exhaust or cooking fumes.



Strobe Light For Hearing Impaired:

For persons who cannot hear an alarm.



Relay Module:

Activates or deactivates auxiliary devices such as whole house fans, security lights or sirens.
